



## During Super Bowl Week leave the driving – and parking – to Indy Express Bus

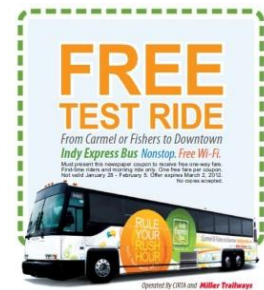
Commuters from Fishers and Carmel who are concerned about the Super Bowl's impact on their downtown commute now have alternative transportation with Indy Express Bus. The buses run weekdays during morning and afternoon rush hours, and fares are \$5 each way. With free Wi-Fi and comfortable seats, you can read, text, sleep or do whatever you like while Indy Express takes care of the driving.

The Carmel park-and-ride location is at Meijer at the corner of Pennsylvania Street and West Carmel Drive. The Fishers park-and-ride location is at Prairie View at Crosspoint, which is at the northeast corner of 106<sup>th</sup> Street and Lantern Road on the west side of I-69.

Usually, the Carmel buses stop at 10 downtown locations, and the Fishers buses at eight, but that will change slightly during Super Bowl Week due to downtown road closures (see the schedule).

First-time riders can try Indy Express for free. You'll find a coupon for a free one-way trip in the Fishers and Carmel editions of the Indianapolis Star on Thursdays in January. The coupons expire on March 1 and may not be used during Super Bowl week.

## Super Bowl Week route adjustments

For schedules and routes visit [www.IndyExpressBus.com](http://www.IndyExpressBus.com). Because of Super Bowl traffic and lane closures, Indy Express will adjust its downtown routes Jan. 27 through Feb. 3. Those changes include:

- The Pennsylvania and Ohio stop will be relocated one block north to Pennsylvania and New York Street
- Pennsylvania and Washington will be eliminated
- Pennsylvania and Henry will be eliminated
- Illinois and Market will be eliminated

All of the other regular stops will be made.

Indy Express will work hard to operate as closely to published schedule times as possible, but passengers will need to be patient as traffic will undoubtedly be heavy. Passengers boarding the 7:45 am inbound service and the 6 pm and 6:05 pm outbound service may be impacted by Super Bowl traffic conditions more than the other schedules.

Normal operations will resume on Monday, Feb. 6. We look forward to seeing you onboard.
