Hamilton County commuters invited to learn about vanpools

Hamilton County residents who work in downtown Indianapolis are invited to a lunchand-learn session about vanpooling on May 12 at noon at the Julia M. Carson Transit Center, 201 E. Washington St.

"This is for everyone who's tired of a long commute and might be interested in saving money and sharing driving responsibilities with others," said Andrew McGee, assistant director for Commuter Connect, which is the rideshare service of CIRTA.

A vanpool is made up of 5 to 15 people who agree to travel to work together in a van provided for a fare by Commuter Connect. Everyone meets at a Park and Ride location, where they leave their vehicles during the work day.
